# PRESIDENT'S REPORT - FORGE HAMU

Well, the 2023 season is just about done. If you have been on the CourtReserve site, you have probably seen the official closing date of the club set as October 15<sup>+</sup> at 10 am. We are planning to leave at least two courts open for play after that date, however, clubhouse services will close shortly thereafter as we prepare to put the club to bed until next year.

It has been quite the season with many changes all happening at the same time, our long-term club manager was replaced by Robert and Andrew Szilagyi, the introduction of our new court booking system, the demise of our ancient clay roller and replacement with a new walk-behind roller, the challenges of the heavy and fierce rainfalls throughout July and first part of August severely affected our play and the scarifying and re-grading of our courts, giving them a new lease on life.

Much more work is needed to both maintain and extend the life of the courts; however, this will come at a significant cost to the club. An irrigation system needs to be installed which will reduce our clay and maintenance costs as well as the unearthing and re-establishment of the court playing area to prevent grass growth. The cost is estimated at approximately \$60,000 for the irrigation system and possibly an additional \$30,000 to properly dig and establish the court playing area. The club has submitted another Trillium request for funding but has yet to hear if we qualify or not.

We are positioned to repay the CEBA loan by December 2023 thereby benefiting from the \$10,000 forgivable portion. Our current Trillium loan was subject to a renewal this year at the rate of 9.45%. Our current balance is approximately \$23,000 with monthly payments of \$850.

Clay will be ordered within the next few weeks for delivery in April. We are hopeful to secure today's prices as clay has almost doubled in price since 2021 when we received a full shipment. Club operational costs will continue to be a concern for the upcoming Executive, and we may need to prepare ourselves for some increases in fees to maintain the club.

As the season closes, we look to those members who have not had an opportunity to volunteer, to assist with the closing. We also recognize several members who maintain some core services behind the scenes, such as Lynn Yule who has been caring for our first aid kit (which we are glad has had little use of this year) and Jim Sutcliffe who has been religiously testing our defibrillator to ensure it is in working order should the need arise. There are several behind the scenes volunteer members who provide key core services and deserve a big thank you from our club.

Along with Jared, they were wet to the bone some days.... literally, in trying to prepare courts with the unusual amount of rain, and high number of rainy days. Members do help with the maintenance of the courts, when needed, and a special thank you to Ed Salahub for his continued weekly (all season) support to the staff.

A new roller was purchased for \$8,700.00, as the old one posed a health hazard. Bathroom repairs, wear and tear and a repair to the fridge door was approximately \$400.00-500.00. General upkeep of various areas are always ongoing. Some boards need to be replaced by the entrance. Members were a great help to tend to the lawns, thank you Jim Bischoff for grass cutting, trimming by Brent Butler, and others I may not know about. Replacement of ONE light on court 5 was \$1350.00. I was glad I was sitting down hearing about this invoice, but I have been told bringing in a cherry picker is the main cost. If you KNOW of any other options, please let us know.

Many members are not aware of the costs, day to day, week to week regarding property, but it all adds up as you can see. QPTC is VERY fortunate as we have members who are willing to help with many other things to be done which saves the club considerable costs. Thank you to Richard Morrison for donating and refilling all the water bottles for the Water fountain, and his sidekick Gerry Mastroianni.

The property was cleared of tree limbs/branches along the fence lines by Vital Tree Care.

Thank you to all members who helped throughout the season, especially Gene Moher and Phil Adams, who continually donate their time, advice, tools and skills to the club.

This season, we are fortunate that the Fundraising amount raised off-set close to all property costs once the club opened. (The spring work done before opening was just over \$16,000.00). Moving forward I would strongly suggest we have a "Contingency Fund" for unexpected issues, and upgrades that deem necessary.

The Garden Keepers: Thank you to Julie Stark, Denise Kouri, Julie Bell and Catherine Dalton for tending to the gardens all season! Thank you, ladies, they looked great.

#### MEMBERSHIP DIRECTOR - HEATHER SHUTE

A new on-line Membership Application and Payment system was brought in this year, and it ran quite smoothly and was very successful.

Each member submitted membership details directly to the database, so we know it was accurate and etransfer payments were quick and easy. This year we had 218 paying members, of which 27 were new to the club and 24 were Family Juniors so we hope that means future members. Although our membership was down this year, we are encouraged by the number of new members. Pickleball has been a factor for sure in our membership, but we also have a few crossovers. Thank you for your support and we hope to see you all again next year. Recruit your friends and family members. We want everyone to know that tennis is a great game.
